

**SAN JUAN COUNTY 4-H RODEO
YOUTH CODE OF CONDUCT**

The San Juan County (SJC) 4-H Rodeo Association will follow the following guidelines for disciplinary action:

CONDUCT:

- (1) Having any association with alcoholic beverages, narcotic or other non-medical drugs during the rodeo season (currently from 9/01/2016 to 09/01/2017).**
- (2) Rowdy behavior, quarreling or fighting in the actual domain of the arena at any time or any place on the premises during the duration of the scheduled Rodeo.**
- (3) Conduct or speech of any kind detrimental to the best interests of the San Juan County 4-H Rodeo Association or the sport of rodeo while in attendance, or coming to and going home from a rodeo.**
- (4) Property damage by contestants or their associates; damage must be reported to the County Extension Agent and if damage if not reported, contestant will be banned from the San Juan County Rodeo Association permanently and reported to law authorities for prosecution.**
- (5) Contestants will be disqualified for vandalism at any place or any time.**
- (6) Cheating or attempting to cheat.**
- (7) Any contestants or parents attempting to fix, threaten, bribe, influence, harass or coerce any rodeo official at any time between opening and closing of a rodeo.**
- (8) Missing any mandatory meeting, safety seminar or equipment check.**

For any infraction of the above stated Code of Conduct, the SJC 4-H Rodeo Board of Directors may enforce a level of penalty up to the following:

- 1. 1st Offense**
 - a. 1 rodeo suspension**
- 2. 2nd Offense**
 - a. Suspension for remaining rodeo season**
