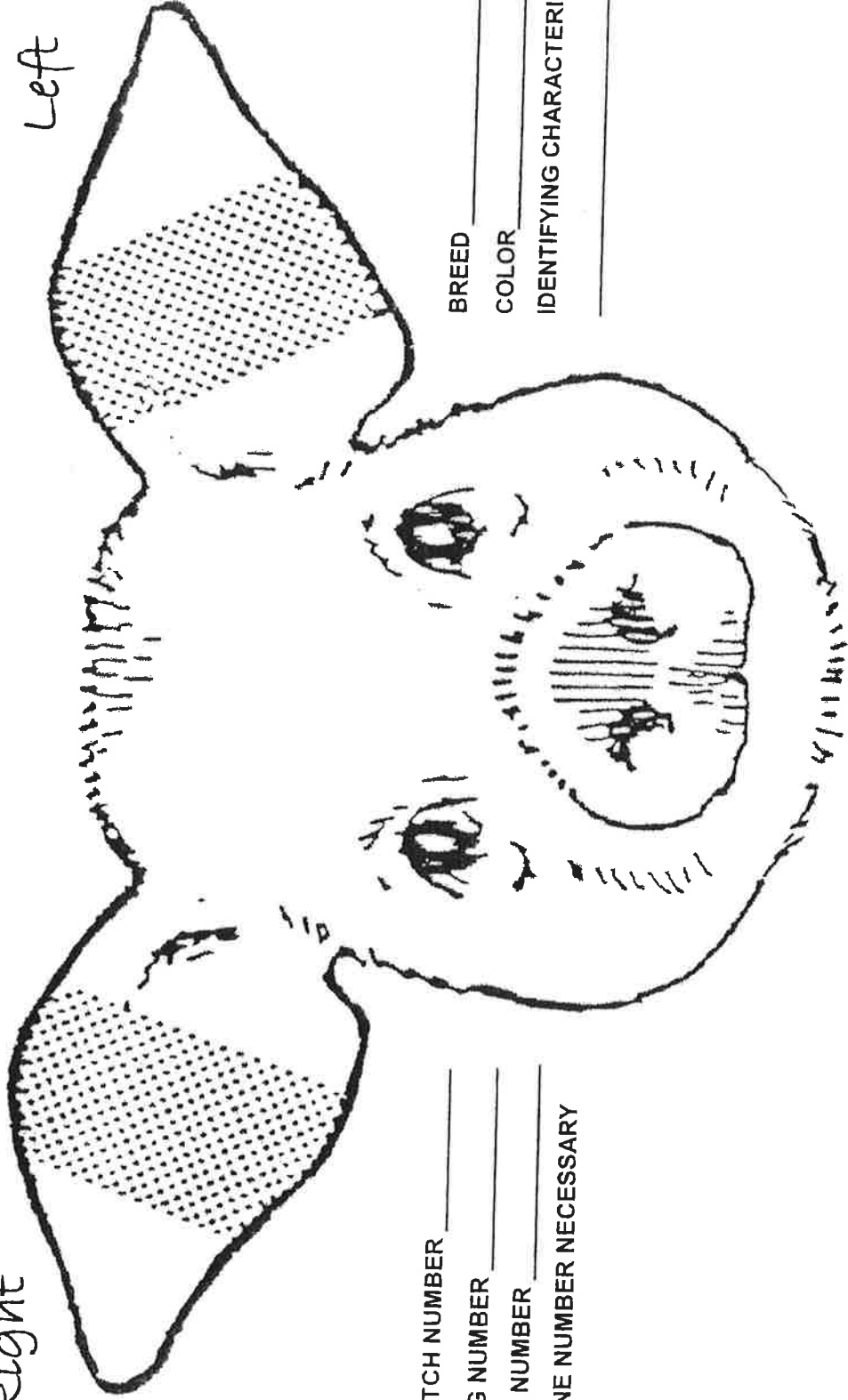


# Pig Identification

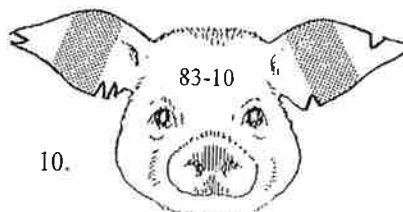
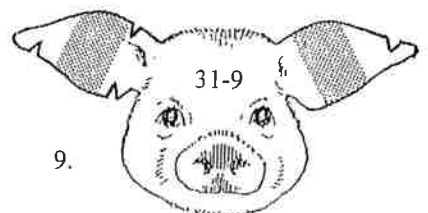
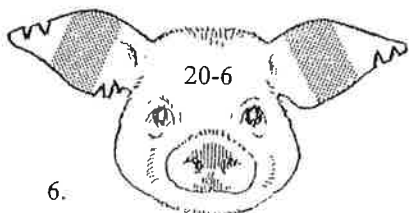
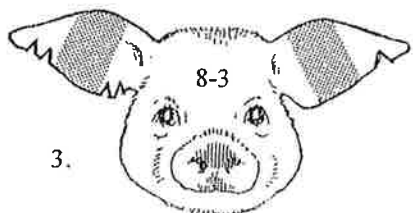
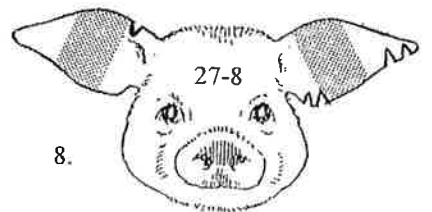
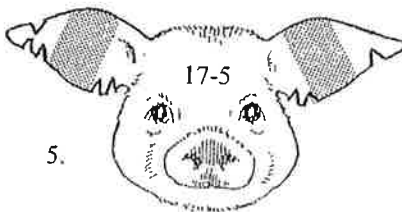
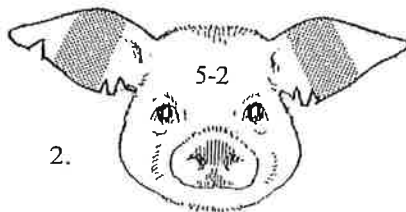
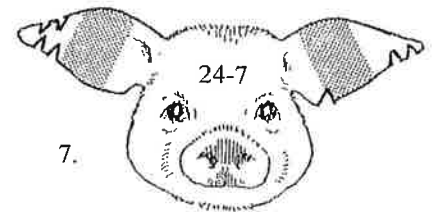
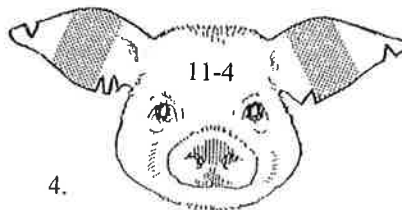
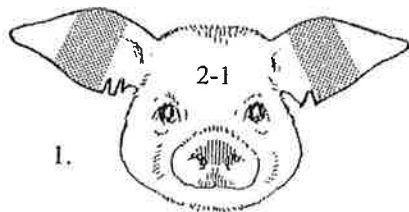
# EAR NOTCHES



Right ear is used for litter number. All pigs in same litter must have the same ear notches in this ear. Right ear is on pig's own right.

Left ear is used for individual pig number in the litter. Each pig in a litter will have different notches in this ear.

**This system will identify 161 litters.**



1. Take full notch in baby pig's ear so notch will not grow shut.
2. Notching pigs as soon as possible after farrowing will prevent errors.  
To avoid mistaking a "3" notch for a "1" notch (or vice versa) do not notch the shaded area of ear.
