





Dairy Goat Meetings



Have a child who loves horses — or is just curious about learning more? You don't need to own a horse to join any of these exciting 4-H equine education contests! These events are open to Novice, Junior, and Senior 4-H members and are designed to build knowledge, confidence, and teamwork while having fun.

PHORSE JUDGING

Participants learn to evaluate horses based on conformation, movement, and performance.

Members study balance, muscling, breed characteristics, and how well horses perform in various classes such as Western Pleasure, Reining, or Trail.

Novice & Junior members can compete at County and District Contests.

Senior members advance to State Contest, with top teams earning a chance to compete nationally.

Judging helps youth develop public speaking, decision-making, and confidence — all without needing to own or ride a horse.

HORSE"

This hands-on event combines everything from horse anatomy and nutrition to tack identification and equine health. Youth rotate through stations, complete written tests, and may participate in team problem-solving scenarios.

Hippology brings classroom learning to life, encouraging teamwork and critical thinking.

Members gain skills useful in veterinary science, equine therapy, and animal management careers.

HORSE BOWL

If your child enjoys trivia or competition, Horse Bowl is a fast-paced, buzzer-style game show covering all aspects of horse science and 4-H materials. Teams face off to answer questions quickly and accurately — a fun and energetic way to learn!

Horse Bowl is a team-based event that encourages camaraderie, quick thinking, and deep horse knowledge.




