

2025 Junior Livestock DNA and Nomination Procedures

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY! IMPORTANT DEADLINES

Market Beef, Dairy Replacement Heifers & Breeding Heifers

Ownership: June 15, 2025

DNA Deadline: June 15, 2025 - Market Beef, Dairy Replacement Heifers only

Entry Deadline: August 1, 2025

Market Swine, Market Goats & Market Lambs

Ownership: June 15, 2025 DNA Deadline: June 15, 2025 Entry Deadline: August 1, 2025

Jr. Wether Doe & Jr. Commercial Ewe

Ownership: June 15, 2025

DNA Deadline: None - Must have 840 Tag

Entry Deadline: August 1, 2025

ALL MARKET animals including Dairy Replacement Heifers will be required to submit a DNA sample, excluding Breeding Heifers, Jr. Wether Doe & Jr. Commercial Ewe. NMSF recommends that the County Agent or Teacher pull the sample. If someone other than these officials will be pulling the sample, please be sure to identify that person on the collection envelope. Be sure to tag the animal's ear before taking the sample. Instructions for taking the DNA samples are as follows:

- Fill out the information on the collection envelope.
- Using clean pliers pull out 30-40 dry hairs. The follicles must be intact.
- Place the hair sample in the collection envelope and seal it.
- The packets MUST be signed by the exhibitor, parent and extension agent. They will NOT be accepted if there is a signature missing.
