Step 1: Contact your club leader to let them know if you are returning or if there are changes in your family like younger sibling aging into 4-H.

Step 2: After October 8th (but before November 14th!) login to you existing 4-H Zsuites account. Your information should have rolled over.

Step 3: Update your information as needed. Download the 4-H Code of Conduct and medical release forms. Sign and upload into zsuites, or return to your leader or drop off at the Extension office.

Step 4: Add all of the projects you are interested in-even if you aren't sure. This will add you to the contact lists so you will get notified if there are special events or workshops.

LEARN, COMPETE, AND GROW — JOIN OUR 4-H HORSE JUDGING, HIPPOLOGY, & HORSE BOWL TEAMS!



Have a child who loves horses — or is just curious about learning more? You don't need to own a horse to join any of these exciting 4-H equine education contests! These events are open to Novice, Junior, and Senior 4-H members and are designed to build knowledge, confidence, and teamwork while having fun.



HORSE JUDGING

Participants learn to evaluate horses based on conformation, movement, and performance. Members study balance, muscling, breed characteristics, and how well horses perform in various classes such as Western Pleasure, Reining, or Trail.

Novice & Junior members can compete at County and District Contests.

Senior members advance to State Contest, with top teams earning a chance to compete nationally. Judging helps youth develop public speaking, decision-making, and confidence — all without needing to own or ride a horse.

듣 HIPPOLOGY ("STUDY OF THE HORSE")

This hands-on event combines everything from horse anatomy and nutrition to tack identification and equine health. Youth rotate through stations, complete written tests, and may participate in team problem-solving scenarios.

Hippology brings classroom learning to life, encouraging teamwork and critical thinking. Members gain skills useful in veterinary science, equine therapy, and animal management careers.

HORSE BOWL

If your child enjoys trivia or competition, Horse Bowl is a fast-paced, buzzer-style game show covering all aspects of horse science and 4-H materials. Teams face off to answer questions quickly and accurately — a fun and energetic way to learn!

Horse Bowl is a team-based event that encourages camaraderie, quick thinking, and deep horse knowledge.

LEVELS OF PARTICIPATION

Novice (ages 9-11): County and District contests

Junior (ages 12-13): County and District contests

Senior (ages 14-18): County and State contests, with opportunities for national qualification

All contests follow New Mexico 4-H and NMSU rules and resources — materials and practice guides are provided during practices!
