## New Mexico 4-H Youth Development Program & San Juan County 4-H Rodeo Adult Code of Conduct

In accordance with New Mexico State 4-H Policies and Procedures all participants (members, leaders, parents and other attendees) at 4-H activities at any level will adhere to high standards of personal behavior and conduct. Parents and/or guardians of 4-H rodeo participants are required to sign the following adult code of conduct regarding responsible behavior at all 4-H activities, including 4-H rodeos. This form must accompany the youth rodeo entry form for youth to be eligible to participate in San Juan County 4-H Rodeos. The positive influence of caring, capable and responsible adults plays an important role in the lives of youth and the 4-H Youth Development Program. Adults working with 4-H youth are charged to lead by example and create a sense of belonging for the youth they support. Volunteering in 4-H is a privilege, not a right. Therefore, by signing this form \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ agrees to conduct him or herself in a responsible manner and abide by all expectations as stated.

## **Expectations:**

- To cooperate with, support and empower adult staff and the rodeo committee as they facilitate the 4-H rodeo program.
- To oversee the health, safety and whereabouts of the youth while at rodeo events and activities.
- To abide by the same rules as the youth as spelled out in their code of conduct, 4-H appropriate clothing guidelines, and use or possession of alcohol, drugs or weapons, before, during or after an event.
- To orient youth participants as to expectations of dress, manners, safety, punctuality, etc. for the event and to answer concerns and questions of the youth.
- To enforce all written and signed behavior expectations established for youth participating in the 4-H Youth Development program.
- To refrain from causing or demonstrating conflict with other parents, volunteers, chaperones or 4-H agents in front of youth.
- To act in the best interest of the youth in the event of an emergency.
- To communicate with fellow adults and youth in an appropriate manner with no swearing, cursing or abusive language in all forms of communication, including social media.
- To avoid sexual contact of any type with youth and/or personal displays of affection with other adults in the presence of youth.
- To not ignore situations involving bullying, hazing or harassment, nor fail to intervene if youth are being threatened, humiliated, or intimidated by other youth or adults.

**ANY VIOLATION OF THE ABOVE EXPECTATIONS** will result in a hearing with the currently elected 4-H rodeo adult board and the county 4-H agent. The adult board has the authority to determine what disciplinary action the infraction will result in with approval from the County 4-H Agent. This includes written warnings outlining code of conduct infractions and corrective measures / expectations, up to a probationary period and suspension of adult and/or child from SJC 4-H rodeo(s). In the result of a state 4-H policy violation, action(s) towards resolution of the issue(s) will be taken by the appropriate NMSU Extension 4-H entities or personnel in sequential order through the SJC 4-H Rodeo Board, SJC County Extension Office via the County 4-H Agent, then the New Mexico State 4-H Department.

I understand that as an adult I should model positive behaviors and lead by example. I also understand that my behavior not only affects the youth, but the entire 4-H Youth Development Program and that I represent myself, my son or daughter's 4-H club, San Juan County 4-H and the overall State 4-H Program. Therefore, I have read and understand the expectations related to the Code of Conduct for Adults and agree to be bound by it.
